### **SAU Seventh at Chamberlyne**

Danville, Ark. – Arkansas Tech finished first in the ATU Collegiate Golf Classic at Chamberlyne Country Club in Danville Tuesday. While ATU, the host school, shot a two-day total 589, Southern Arkansas was seventh with a 636, after finishing first round play on Monday tied for sixth at 324.

Following Arkansas Tech in second place was Central Arkansas with 597, Henderson State was third, shooting a 602, the ATU “B” Team was fourth with a 610, Delta State shot 620 to finish fifth, Southwest Baptist (Mo.) was sixth with 631, Ouachita Baptist followed SAU in eighth, shooting a 639, and Pittsburg State (Kan.) was ninth with 663.

Every team in the classic shot better the second day than the first. ATU went from 296 to 293, UCA from 304 to 293, HSU from 302 to 300, ATU “B” from 319 to 301, SBU from 324 to 307, SAU from 324 to 312, OBU from 331 to 308, and PSU from 332 to 331.

Daniel Haughton of Central Arkansas was the individual medalist, finishing first with a two-day total of 144. Luke Calcaterra of Arkansas Tech and Allen Branson of Henderson State were just one shot back at 145. Ben Sanders of Arkansas Tech “B” and B.J. Hawkins of Tech tied for fourth at 147, and Scott Mason of Henderson State, and Scott Genoway of Arkansas Tech tied for sixth with 148.

The Muleriders’ Greg Griffin got his first top 20 finish of the season, tying for 19th at 155. Josh Smith shot a 157 to tie for 24th, Lance Lester tied for 27th with a 158, and Heath Grant tied for 39th with a two-day total of 166.

Southern Arkansas will be off for two weeks before playing at Eagle Mountain in Batesville, March 27-28, hosted by Lyon College.
