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### **Southern Arkansas Hosts Track Meet**

Magnolia, Ark. --- Southern Arkansas University, Harding University, and Hendrix College competed in a triangular track and field meet here Thursday under a bright blue sky. No points were kept.

Southern Arkansas freshman Brandon Suell was a double winner in the men's division, winning the 100-meter dash in 10.60 and the 200 in 22.20. Suell nipped teammate Ed White in the 100 with White timed in 10.64. Truas Desisso of Harding was third in 10.71, Dan Keithley of Southern Arkansas was fourth in 10.80 with unattached sprinters Anthony Dunn, Authur Shaw, and Shelby Arberry finishing fifth, sixth, and seventh in times of 10.93, 10.97, and 11.27.

Trailing Suell in the 200 were Dunn in 22.25, Shaw in 22.30, White in 22.47, Keithley in 22.49, Rudy Stennis of Southern Arkansas in 22.59, and Jeremy Cobb of Hendrix in 26.59.

Ricky Martinez of Southern Arkansas won the 400 in 50.15 with unattached L. Gordon second in 50.36, and Tirrell Grace of Southern Arkansas third in 51.99. In the 800-meter run, Chris Taliuferro of Harding was first in 2:00.27 and Greg Varner of Hendrix was second in 2:10.85.

In the 1,500, T.J. Davidson of Harding was first in 4:15.17, unattached Jermaine Jones second in 4:16.79, Tim Cannon of Southern Arkansas third in 4:20.50, Matt Quinn of Southern Arkansas fourth in 4:22.46, Robert Gardner of Harding fifth in 4:31.77, Elliot Isom of Southern Arkansas sixth in 4:32.45, and Blaine Slack of Southern Arkansas seventh in 4:43.10.

Adrian Romanos of Southern Arkansas won the 5,000 in 15:46.47, Matt Creggan of Harding was second in 15:54.92, Tyler Johnson of Southern Arkansas third in 16:22.73, Ben Collins of Harding fourth in 16:47.73, A.J. Stewart of Southern Arkansas fifth in 16:52.00, and Tim Cannon of Southern Arkansas sixth in 17:32.96.

Eli Elias of Southern Arkansas won the 110-meter hurdles in 15.47 with teammate Kiley Smith second in 15.53. Nathan Large of Hendrix was third in 17.84. In the 400-meter intermediate hurdles, James Mason of Harding was first in 57.31 with Elias second in 57.45 and Large was third in a distant 1:04.80.

Southern Arkansas won both the 400 and 1600-meter relays. The Muleriders won the 400 in 42.8 with Harding second in 43.5 and were first in the 1600 in 3:24.47 with Harding's "B" team second in 3:52.80. The 'Rider 400 team was Suell, Keithley, Martinez, and E. White and the 1600 team was Stennis, Anthony Gerhard, Martinez, and Keithley.

In the field events, John Gray of Hendrix was first in the javelin with 125-4 with Landon Ganus of Harding second with 124-1, Ken Collins of Harding third in 117-2, and David Routon of Hendrix fourth in 102-2 ½. Ganus won the high jump with 6-0 and teammate Chase Martin was second with 5-8. Troy Baker of Harding was first in the shot put with 44-1, Gray was second with 38-10, and Ben Pollitzer of Hendrix was third with 32-7. Arberry won the long jump with 19-9 and Ganus was second with 17-5. Gray

became a double winner by taking first place in the discus with a 136-0 toss. Baker was second with 125-5, and Dajuan Patton of Harding was third with 90-11.

In women's running events, Kyrstal James of Southern Arkansas was first in the 100-meter hurdles in 16.93 with Jennifer Jones of Hendrix second in 18.91 and Tara Tarole of Harding was first in the 400 hurdles in 1:13.21 with James second in 1:18.81, and Jones third in 1:23.23.

Amy Bingman of Harding was first in the 100-meter dash in 13.33 and first in the 200 in 27.6 with the only other competitor, Danielle Whitehouse of Hendrix, second in 23.14. Whitehouse won the 400 in 1:00.31 with Jessica Brown and Ladoris Williams of Harding finishing second and third with respective times of 1:02.17 and 1:09.93.

In the 800, Vicky Echiverra and Jessica Pingrey of Harding placed one-two in the 800-meter run with times of 2:26.73 and 2:26.88, respectively. London Hall of Southern Arkansas was third in 2:29.31, Ashley Weeks of Southern Arkansas fourth in 2:33.63, Kristi LeBlanc of Hendrix fifth in 2:36.71, Rebecca Landry of Southern Arkansas sixth in 2:43.71, and Sharon Bishop of Southern Arkansas seventh in 2:55.38.

Gaby Mendoza of Southern Arkansas was first in the 1,500-meter run in 4:53.93 with Echiverra second in 4:55.73, Sarah Reardon of Harding third in 5:10.23, Tessa Tarole of Harding fourth in 5:16.01, Holly Skelton of Harding fifth in 5:50.59, and Terri Harding of Harding sixth in 6:20.88.

Reardon won the 5,000 in 18:21.44, Mary Brown of Harding was second in 18:51, Mendoza was third in 19:43.19, Lindsay Musielak of Southern Arkansas fourth in 19:55.56, and Jessica Cornett of Harding fifth in 20:51.53.

In the field events, Shelley Johnson of Southern Arkansas was first in the javelin with a toss of 107-6, Jade Thompson of Hendrix was second with 76-6, Jessie Mailes of Southern Arkansas was third with 67-7, and Robin Riddle of Southern Arkansas was fourth with 61-5.

Johnson was first in the shot put with a 34-8 heave, Danielle Brown of Hendrix was second with 31-4, Jessica Brown of Harding third with 24-2, and Bingman of Harding fourth with 22-9.

Sharon Bishop of Southern Arkansas won the high jump with 4-8 and Sara Rhodes of Southern Arkansas was second with 4-4. Brown was first in the long jump with 15-10 and Tara Tarole was second with 13-10. Tara Tarole was first in the triple jump with 28-7 ½.

Johnson was a triple winner for the Lady 'Riders by taking first place in the discus with 104-2 ½. Emily Baines of Harding was second with 93-1, Brown was third with 81-0, Tessa Tarole fourth with 72-11, Riddle fifth with 68-5, and Rhodes sixth with 66-1.

The next track and field meet for Southern Arkansas will be March 27 in Memphis, Tenn., hosted by the University of Memphis.
