Muleriders, Lady Muleriders Run in Mississippi Twilight

Clinton, Miss. - Southern Arkansas competed at the Mississippi College Twilight Friday, hosted by Mississippi College. In the men's division, Mississippi College was first with 167 points, Hinds Community College was second with 100, Jackson State was third with 96, and SAU fourth with 83. In the women's division, Jackson State was first with 261, Mississippi College second with 78, Southern Arkansas third with 40, and Paul Quinn College fourth with 15.

In the men's division, SAU sprinter Jermaine Logan was first in both the 100 and 200-meter dashes. Logan had easy wins in both events in the respective times of 10.50 and 21.11. Mulerider football player Chris Turner was first in the shot put with an easy win on a toss of 50-3.5, and was second in the discus with a throw of 115-2. Eli Eilas of SAU was first in the 400-intermediate hurdles in 55.35, and teammate Shane McLelland second in 57.68. The SAU 1600-meter relay team was first in a time of 3:23.18 for an easy win.

Adrian Romanos was second in the 5,000-meter run in a time of 15:41.30, teammate Cade Lambert was fourth in 17:32.30, and Elliot Isom was fifth in 17:47.49. Johnathan Deloney was fifth in the 800-meter run in 2:02.40, and Cade Lambert was sixth in 2:05.56.

In the women's division, the Lady Muleriders swept the first three places in the 1,500-meter run with Gaby Mendoza first in 5:03.71, Kendall Mears second in 5:03.91, and Lindsay Musielak third in 5:21.81. In the 5,000, Mears was first in 19:23.94, and Musielak third in 20:20.27.

Southern Arkansas will compete in the Bison Invitational Saturday, hosted by Harding University, in Searcy.
